Lighthouse staff sit on the Boards of **OTC** (Out of School Time Council, **YSN** (Youth Success Network), **Louisville Youth Opportunity**, and **Alliance for Youth** (formerly the Youth Delinquency Prevention Council). In addition, Lighthouse meets all 20/20 **Better Business Bureau Charity Accountability Standards**. **All our programs serve students at NO CHARGE!**

Highlights









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In the Fall of 2023, due to JCPS bus shortage, we purchased 2 large vehicles to transport students from their JCPS school to our facility. We utilized these vehicles throughout 2024. We offered **Academic**, **Social Emotional Learning, and Youth Development programs** along with partnerships allowing us many different kinds of learning opportunities. These included but are not limited to Jay Cee's Table, Bounce Coalition, Looking for Lillith, ECHO, Stock Yard Bank Financial Literacy, and more. We offer programs such as STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math); Literacy; College and Career Readiness; peace building programs/violence prevention programs, JA, 4H; SEL Programs, Karate; Basketball; HALO; Boys 2 Men; music; art; a full GED and full ESL programs. We hosted a **FREE themed summer program** called, "Unity in Diversity: Exploring Cultures Together" focusing on each unique child's academic and social emotional needs with the goal of uniting families and violence prevention.











We partner with JCPS, Metro United Way, and Metro Louisville to ensure a quality program. We have also been commissioned a **BLOCStar** and on **Louisville Linked/211** system. We are participants in **United Community**. We are also participating in the 3rd **Grade Reading Pledge!** We are partners with the **FACE IT** program whose goal is to wipe out Child Abuse in Louisville. Lighthouse staff sit on the Boards of **Newburg Anti-Violence Coalition Team** and **YES Network** through OSCN, **Youth Success Network** (Formerly BLOCS- Building Louisville's Out of School Coordinating System), **Youth Opportunity**, and **Alliance for Youth** (formerly the Youth Delinquency Prevention Council) plus a member of the **OST Council** which unites OST programs in the area. We were one of the FIRST organizations to become a **NO HIT ZONE**. We are approved by the Better Business Bureau Charitable Review Committee and meet all 20/20 Better Business Bureau Charity Accountability Standards. All our programs serve students at **NO CHARGE!**

KARATE NOTE: Master Celita Dillon, along with other adults and students, traveled to the Czech Republic to represent Team USA, Dillon's Karate, and Lighthouse Academy at an international Karate tournament hosting over 22,000 competitors from 34 countries! They also participate in regional tournaments where all the Karate students placed in the top 4 for Forms, Fighting, and Chambri. We received the Most Supportive School Award at Lighthouse Academy at Newburg!







Our Health and Back to School Fair served over 1200 people in 2024!













Program Impact

DATA AT A GLANCE:

- Lighthouse Student Average Attendance at JCPS: 97.2% vs JCPS Average Attendance 94.3%
- 2 out of every 3 elementary students are at or on track to proficiency in Reading and Math
- 100% of the same elementary students are at or on track to proficiency in Science and Social Studies
- 90% of intermediate/middle school students are at or on track to proficiency in Reading and Language Arts
- 4 out of 5 students in the same grades are at or on track to proficiency in Math, Science, and Social Studies
- None of our students have been suspended this year.

SRYB Data results (past and present) Processed through the Weikart Center as pre/post surveys
• Lighthouse uses the SRYB to understand and assess students for their SEL needs. Among the four domains assessed across our programming, students collectively increased their scores in three of the domains while remaining constant in the fourth. Students were assessed and showed an average increase in Expressing Emotional Knowledge (4% increase), Behaviorally Manages Emotion (14.3% increase), and Displays Goal-Striving Mastery (7% increase). Students collectively maintained their ability to Display Social-Role Mastery.

August 3, 2024 Lighthouse Health and Back to School Fair served 1233, gave away 975 Back Packs, over 80 physicals, 700 lunches, and had over 60 volunteers. We also gave vision screenings through Lions Eye.



Testimonials and Survey Feedback

Student feedback (surveys)

- Most of the students reported that if they didn't attend programs at Lighthouse, they would most likely be at home engaging in non-academic activities, consuming large amounts of screen time on electronics, or be home alone.
- This resulted in the majority of students articulating that they want to be at Lighthouse because they want to be in a safe, nurturing, caring environment where they know they will be able to receive academic help, be who they are (individuality), enjoy learning and school, and stay out of trouble.
- "Throughout my life, I could only imagine the things that I could accomplish. To be honest, I have surprised the little boy I used to be by the things I have done. I never dreamed I would be going to college and here I am almost ready to move onto campus. Lighthouse taught me that if I set my mind to doing something, I could get there. It sure is crazy, the things you can accomplish-but I am not done here. I plan to do much more and once I have my degree, I plan to take my career in cybersecurity into an even higher level."
- All but one student articulated there was a caring adult they could go to at Lighthouse and believed that this relationship was helpful in the community and at home (beyond Lighthouse)

Parent Survey Data (surveys)

- 90% of parents were extremely satisfied with the programming provided by Lighthouse
- 100% of parents reported their child(ren) had a positive attitude towards learning
- 100% of parents reported their child(ren) had increased sense of belonging and improved socialemotional well-being
- 100% of parents reported their child(ren) had a more positive attitude towards school
- "After the program, my daughter was noticeably better with her math and reading comprehension."
- "Lighthouse has helped (my child) her get a sense of who she really is."
- "My children are more confident doing (school) work."
- "My son has always done well in school, but Lighthouse gives him that extra push."
- "The teachers at Lighthouse all show love and hold students accountable to the choices they make. My family cannot thank you enough. I am a living example of the positive effect community involvement has on families."
