1 On 1 Tutors work with elementary students on Tuesdays or Thursdays from 4:30 to 5:30 at the Lighthouse Academy. Thanks to the number who have volunteered to work with the same student at least once a month, 11 students are able to meet each week with a caring adult who is committed to their success, especially in improved reading skills which is something JCPS is stressing in their 3rd grade reading pledge. They help them with their homework, read with them, play games with them and basically are just a friendly encouragement to them.
