Lighthouse Academy at Newburg - A Site for Adult Education

JCPS ADULT EDUCATION: GED AND ESL CLASSES

While Lighthouse Academy at Newburg is predominantly an after-school program for Louisville youth, we also recognize the importance of adult education in our community. Lighthouse Academy at Newburg is a proud site for the JCPS Adult Education program in both Adult Basic Education (GED) and English as a Second Language (ESL) classes.

For the last seventy-five years, JCPS has strove to provide education for adults in Louisville. Funds for the program are secured through a grant with the state. The program must pass not only JCPS requirements, but also the Kentucky Department of Education. To enter, all adult students enroll under Adult Education and test in either TABE, a Test of Adult Basic Education, or CASAS, a test for ESL students. After forty hours of education, the students retest to show progress.

Lighthouse has been an Adult Basic Education site for close to ten years and very recently became a site for Lifeskills ESL classes. So far this year, Lighthouse has been a site for twenty-five students in GED classes and eighteen in ESL classes. "Lifeskills ESL classes range from literacy level students with little English or perhaps not literate in their native language so must learn a reading system to advanced level. Lifeskills classes cover topics on the community, shopping, health, government, job skills, economics, grammar, and conversation," said Susan Ward-Repishti, a JCPS Adult Education Instructor who works at the Lighthouse site. All students in both Adult Basic Education (GED) or ESL classes have access to a classroom at Lighthouse Academy at Newburg along with computers during their studies. Lighthouse Academy at Newburg also acts as a testing site for both GED and ESL students. Classes are reopening on Tuesday, August 2nd. Adults interested in enrolling can contact (502) 485-3400.

Adult education is an extremely important service to provide, and Lighthouse is proud to be a JCPS Adult Education site. "...Lighthouse has been a tremendous opportunity for adult learners in the area. We are so grateful for this site..." Susan concluded.

However, many find it's not only easier than imagined, but an incredibly rewarding choice. In this segment of giving, we'll discuss how donations are used at Lighthouse Academy at Newburg and the ways to become a monetary Lighthouse Academy at Newburg donor.

The first step any donor should consider is what causes are important to you. Our opinion at Lighthouse Academy at Newburg, is your support should always be to a cause you are passionate about. In short, nonprofits are a tax-exempt organization that are created to provide help or contribute to creating a better community for people, locally or globally. At Lighthouse Academy at Newburg, we strive to give our local Louisville children a safe atmosphere where they can grow in education and spirit. We provide all our programs and services free of charge. Donations to Lighthouse Academy at Newburg go directly to support our after-school program, summer day program, service the building and classrooms, and to pay workers that care for the children.

Once you decide where you want to donate, the next step is to decide the amount and frequency you can contribute. Donations can be set up on whatever schedule is most convenient to the donor. Donors can contribute monthly, quarterly, or even once a year. Giving consistently though, even in small amounts, has a positive impact on a nonprofit. Monetary donations at Lighthouse can be mailed directly to our facility at 5312 Shepherdsville Road Louisville, KY 40228.

Donors can also utilize something called the Annual Fund. The Annual Fund is a campaign that many nonprofits mail out at the end of the year. An Annual Fund will share what the organization has accomplished during the year along with a donation form or return payment form. This form will usually be setup as a one-time donation and includes various methods of payment such credit card, cash, or check.

The last option for Lighthouse Academy at Newburg monetary donors is through a community giving site called Give for Good Louisville. Lighthouse Academy at Newburg participates in this community fundraising platform where nonprofits and organizations raise money for their causes locally.
